



Phys Ed and Performing Arts Addition and Renovation Oakland Catholic High School | Pittsburgh, PA



The fourth phase of a five phase design for Oakland Catholic High School, Pittsburgh's premier catholic institution for the education of high school women, is in progress. The project design addresses all facilities issues associated with a modern high school program set in an urban environment.

The existing Oakland Catholic High School was built in 1958 as a double loaded corridor structure with an undersized gymnasium and an oversized cafeteria. The Phase I addition/renovation is now in full use. It includes a NCAA regulation size gymnasium with seating for 750, a state-of-the-art fitness center, new locker rooms and ancillary spaces that are ample enough to support a state championship basketball team and its fans. The existing cafeteria has been completely revived with a new kitchen and a dining hall that is a true compliment to the enriching environment of the school.

Academic needs such as new science facilities, new computerized teaching facilities, an information commons and music and a cyber café complete phases II and III. Spiritual needs are met with the addition of a new chapel that is the focus of the finished complex.
